All,

It's not even certain that 2025 will go to Cuba yet; the lack of hotel rooms is concerning. I sure do want to go there, though. If 2025 ends up in Cuba, then geomorph will focus more on the pediments coming off the Sierra Nacimiento, and perhaps the post-1880's incision of the Rio Puerco. Dan's idea about the copper sulfide mineralization in the Sierra Nacimiento is on my list, as well, though it will likely be in the form of an optional post-trip field site, as it requires serious walking. The main focus of the Cuba-area field day for 2025 will be on Paleogene sedimentary-tectonic links and on post-Eocene faulting in the interior of the basin (is it rift-related, subsidence-related, compression-related, or other?). I'm hoping Shari Kelley et al.'s current mapping in the Llaves area will be incorporated into the field trip, as well.

All,

First, thank you to Bonnie for replying to Susan.

Regarding the 2024 Albuquerque FFC, Dan Koning told me this week that he might be able to lead a field stop or two, but cannot take on the FFC role any more than that. I reached out to the Albuquerque NMBG office (Adam Read, Bruce Allen, and Geoff Rawling) to ask if any of them would take on the leadership of the meeting. Bruce and Adam said no, and Geoff is out of the office for a while but I don't expect he'll accept. Bonnie has been in touch with NMMNHS scientists Larry Crumpler and Jayne Aubele, who have agreed to assist with guidebook editing. We have to find someone who can road log and lead field trips.

This leaves us in a tight spot. To put together an FFC with with 16 months' notice will take an enormous amount of someone's time. We need to find someone who can give us a firm "yes" pretty quickly or consider some out-of-thebox alternatives. If we can't get someone to take on the Albuquerque FFC, we should remember that the 2024 FFC doesn't have to be in Albuquerque - is there someone who could put together an FFC *anywhere* with 16 months' notice? If so, we should consider it. Unfortunately, I cannot move the 2025 FFC up by a year.

Action items:

1. Any ideas for people to ask to lead the 2024 Albuquerque FFC? Karl Karlstrom; Laura Crossey; others? Who should reach out to them?

2. If nobody will take on the Albuquerque FFC logs and field trips, what is our next step and when do we make that decision?

The bulk email system has been upgraded. It now allows an image and PDF to be attached to messages. To reduce message size and load on the system, we should only attach PDFs when they aren't posted online somewhere. If so, we can just include a link to the posted PDF.

E-commerce Changes

Currently, credit card payments for book orders, memberships, and registrations are stored until they can be processed manually, There have always been security concerns with this, but we have been hampered by bank system limitations. In the near future, we expect to migrate to a system that will automatically process credit card payments in real time.

DOIs
