

Specifically the mission of the Society is to advance the public interest in the geosciences, and to foster the next generation of geoscientists through student scholarships and by researching the geology of our state. Dedicated volunteers are the backbone to the success of the Society and a large number of members have contributed immensely this year. As a fellow member, I am indebted to their tireless efforts. It also was emphasized to me this year how much the New Mexico Bureau of Geology and the New Mexico Universities contribute to our Society. These organizations were especially instrumental in providing vehicle and financial support for the fall field conference and facilitated a huge student turnout. We all owe much gratitude to our "sister" organizations.

2017 Scholarships

Student participation in the Society remains strong and the future of the NMGS appears to be in good hands. The Society places high emphasis on the support of students and this year was no exception. The Society awarded \$45,846 to various student initiatives in 2017. Our grants-in-aid provide a major source of funding for students to conduct their research and the students gain valuable experience in preparing proposals that is sure to help them in their professional future. In addition, the Society granted students free memberships to the Society, a reduction in the price of NMGS publications, free attendance to the Annual Spring Meeting, and numerous field scholarships to attend the Fall Field Conference. There was excellent student participation in the Annual Spring Meeting and record student turnout at the Fall Field Conference. The Society should be very proud of their efforts that help students complete their research and prepare them for their professional careers.


