Introduction

The New Mexico Geological Societyhas published 14 guidebooks in connection with the field conferences that it hasheldannually since 1950. These guidebooks contain about 400 articles, notes, abstracts, and road logs concerning the geologyand natural history of the several areas considered during the Field conferences in parts of New Mexico, Arizona, and Colorado. Some of the articles contain new information whereas others are compilations or reviews of old data which in some cases, have been brought up to date. Other articles contain theonly moderngeologic information on certain areas. Although the road logs are of particular value to the newcomer, they can be useful to the "old hand" as well. Thus, the guidebooks and the material they contain can not be ignored by any geologist working in this region, and it is hoped that the following bibliography and index will facilitate mining this wealth of information.

All of the articles, notes, and abstracts contained in the guidebooks are listed and indexed below. The road logs are not listed or indexed but their routes are shown on the Figure (in pocket).
