## **Open Meeting**

1. N. Dunbar called the meeting to order at 7:03 pm.

- 2. Publications report (Kelley) Report submitted
  - Sales were weak in January, but stronger in February and March.
  - Dan Koening arranged for copies of the Tusas Guidebook to be placed at the Ojo Caliente Book Store.
  - A group of road logs and a copy of the highway map have been packaged and will be available at the spring meeting and perhaps at the RMS-GSA in Albuquerque.
  - Point of sale equipment has not been purchased yet.
  - The Bureau is considering a booth at the Tucson Gem & Mineral show, there
    is no cost for a booth, but rooms are expensive during the show. The Bureau
    is also considering a booth at the Silver City Gem & Mineral show and in
    Denver.
- 3. Spring Meeting, April 27, 2012 (Love)
  - Things are well in hand with a full schedule and 26 posters. One hundred and eleven people are registered for the meeting.
  - Chartwell's will set up at
  - Up and down with Chartwell's 7:30 with Oj & donuts, cookies pm, salsa & chips after 3 with beverage of choice.
  - Because of other events, the paleo talks will be in the Copper room in the morning and the afternoon snacks will be downstairs.
  - There was a hitch in abstract submission process, and when abstracts went to the technical chairs, several abstracts got lost. A. Read has designed a slicker process for the future.
- 4. 2012 FFC update (McLemore) Two handouts
  - Roadlogs for Day 1 and 3 have been sent to V. Lueth. V. McLemore is still working on the road log for Day 2.
    - Nine papers have been submitted to V. Lueth and more are coming.
  - A preliminary budget looks more expensive than last year but is still being revised. Details of what expenses NMGS covers were discussed.
    - Currently looking at \$281/person
    - The Foundation covers about 30 students.

- The society covers the cost of 2 field trip leaders (out of 5).
- Registration is waived for the registrars. The Society covers lodging for 1 person (Connie) and the Bureau pays lodging for second (April)
- o Registration is waived and lodging is paid for the drinks person
- Highlands students receive scholarships to cover lodging and registration is waived.
- Change to a 10% contingency fund.

- 5. 2013 FFC update (Timmons)
  - I-40 corridor Flagstaff to Grants. Distance is an issue in trying to go from the Grand Canyon to Grants.
    - Option: pre-meeting trip to GC (Wednesday)
      - Bus participants from Flagstaff to the Grand Canyon and return to Flagstaff for the icebreaker.
      - Visit trail of time, place speakers along the trail of time.
  - Regular 3 days
    - Sunset crater/SF peaks/ meteor crater/sp crater/going to Holbrook (Thursday)
    - o Friday: ½ to full day Petrified Forest and onto Grants
    - Saturday: Mt. Taylor
  - AZGS involvement, how to divide things out, big trip?
    - Should be accomodatable, particulary if we do pre-trip
    - Radisson and conference adjacent to NAU campus
  - Utilize Rt. 66 theme
  - Core of 4 organizers working on general road logs over summer
  - Contact meteor crater re charges
  - Discussion of travel, currently set up as a caravan, because it is not a loop
    - Leave cars in Grants? Will explore possibilities

- 7. Webmaster's report and related Web initiatives (Read)
  - A. Read demonstrated directory and abstract submission.
  - The SSL Security certificate needed for the membership directory has been obtained.
  - Database of members will be searchable by alphabet name, affiliation, specialties and interests.

- Members can can edit their own profiles and opt in or out on what information is available.
  - A. Read hopes to establish a system that allows computer to do contacts rather than giving out e-mails if people so choose
  - Question: available only to NMGS or to anyone?
    - Broad, but allow people to opt out
  - Photos not on this site
- The abstract submission model for NMGS, will format the abstract.
- The scholarship application will have a similar set up.
  - The remaining issue is how to have the student's advisor sign off. The suggestion is that students submit an e-mail for advisor, then the system will contact the advisor.
  - N. Dunbar suggested that letters of reference should be due 1 week after scholarship submissions.
  - Set up for next year for submission of proposals. On-line review will be incorporated the following year.
- 8. Decision on web access to guidebook articles (Dunbar)
  - All guidebook articles from the first 25 years are now available on-line.
     Articles from the last decade are already available in electronic format. It will not take long to post the remaining articles.
