2008 Spring Meeting

The 2008 Spring Meeting will be held on Friday, April 18th at the Best Western Conference Center in Socorro. The theme of the meeting will be regional tectonics and recent geologic mapping in the Rio Grande Rift. Deadline for submission of abstracts is February 15th, 2008. 2008 Fall Field Conference

The next Fall Field Conference will be held in mid-October, 2008, in Silver City, New Mexico. The trip will focus on Eocene-Oligocene volcanism, Paleozoic and Precambrain stratigraphy, and ore deposits of the Gila Wilderness in southwestern New Mexico. Greg Mack and Jim Witcher are the principal conveners of the 2008 conference.

2008 Scholarships and Awards

All scholarships awarded by the New Mexico Geological Society are funded by the NMGS Foundation. The Society coordinates the competitions and makes recommendations to the Foundation for funding. There are two types of scholarships:

- (1) Competitive scholarships that are decided by the NMGS Scholarship Committee. These include the Pipkin Undergraduate Research Award, the Graduate Grants-in-Aid, the Kottlowski Research Award, and the awards for outstanding student presentations at the Spring Meeting.
- (2) Non-competitive scholarships that are awarded by academic departments. These include the Fall Field Conference scholarships, the Pipkin Book Scholarships, the Pipkin Senior Scholarships, the Robert and Beverly Wellnitz Memorial Scholarships, and the Outstanding Senior Award. Not all of these awards are given to each school each year.

REPORTS – 2007 EVENTS

2007 Spring Meeting

Patrick Walsh and Jennifer Whiteis of the New Mexico Bureau of Geology organized the 2007 Annual Spring Meeting in Socorro. There were 142 registrants at the meeting. an increase over the previous year, and 53 abstracts submitted. The theme of this year's meeting was Geothermal Resources of New Mexico and included Jim Witcher as our keynote speaker. Jim's topic was Laramide and older structures as possible primary controls on the occurrence of convective geothermal systems in the Rio Grande Rift and adjacent areas. Abstracts for the meeting were published by the Bureau in the May issue of New Mexico Geology with financial support from the NMGS Foundation.

2007 Fall Field Conference

This year's field conference took place in late September in the beautiful Jemez Mountains of northern New Mexico. This was the Society's first visit to the Jemez Mountains since 1996, and provided attendees with spectacular panoramas of the Valles Caldera and associated volcanic structures. The conference was very wellorganized by Shari Kelley and Barry Kues, with logistical support provided by Kate

Zeigler (her third year in this position). Virgil Lueth, once again serving as the guidebook's Managing Editor, instigated a publishing innovation this year by publishing a separate, spiral-bound set of the road logs (with minipapers only), in addition to the full guidebook with both road logs and technical papers. The spiral-bound compilation of road logs with minipapers is available for separate purchase.

This year's Fall Field Conference will probably be remembered as one of the best in many years, and we wish to thank all the volunteers involved in its organization. A vote of thanks also goes out to this year's intrepid student flaggers, Paul Aragon, Nikita Tenorio, Cavin Rathjen, and Adam Bristol, for keeping us on track even in the dense fog and rain of Day 1.

2007 Honorary Member

Brian Brister was named the 2007 NMGS Honorary Member during the Friday night barbecue at the Valles Caldera National Preserve Headquarters. After receiving his Ph.D. from New Mexico Tech in 1990, Brian spent 8 years working in the petroleum industry, with much of his work focused on hydrocarbon resources of southeastern New Mexico. In 1999 Brian began working for the New Mexico Bureau of Geology and Mineral Resources in Socorro. During his five years with the Bureau Brian directed his research toward the natural gas resources of the San Juan and Raton Basins of northern New Mexico. In 2004 Brian returned to the private sector and is currently employed by Gunn Oil Co. in Wichita Falls, TX. Although he presently resides out-of-state, Brian's commitment to New Mexico geology continues. He was responsible for a recent natural gas discovery in the Tucumcari Basin in eastcentral New Mexico, a semi-frontier basin that has only recently been subject to successful exploratory drilling.

Brian has a career-long history of volunteering in the management of various professional societies. He is currently vice-president of both the North Texas Geological Society and the Southwest Section of the American Association of Petroleum Geologists (AAPG), as well as serving as Scoutmaster of Troop 11 of the

Boy Scouts of America in Wichita Falls. Brian has been a member of NMGS since 1986. His primary involvement with the Society was from 1999 through 2004, during which time he served on the Executive committee, organized a Spring Meeting, and was co-editor of the 2004 Fall Field Conference Guidebook. During Brian's tenure on the Executive Committee it became obvious that the Society's high levels of investment income were endangering our non-profit status. One of Brian's most significant contributions was to assist in creation of the NMGS Foundation, thus providing stable, long-term management of our scholarship assets and ensuring that the Society's non-profit status is protected. We wish to thank Brian for his very substantial and long-term contributions to the Society and to New Mexico geology.
